# Different areas: different skills

# Construction Area

This area enhances children's imagination as they learn to build and create different models using different construction toys (e.g. lego, building bricks, soft/ wooden blocks, Bob the builder tools). Most of the time, they improvise during their play.

# Home Corner/Role Puzzles and Games play Area

Home corner play gives children the opportunity to act out the home environment while assisting them to develop social and language skills. This area supports both individual and cooperative play.

Children are never too young to start learning math skills. Counting, sorting and even working with puzzles are all important first steps to develop a solid base to learn math. Working with puzzles and games also enhances concentration skills.

## Math Area

As the children's interest in math is growing, we set up a Math area for them to work more on numbers. They learn to count with one to one correspondence and to recognize the numbers. They also do simple addition and subtraction in a fun way.

# Sensory and Malleable Area

This area provides children appropriate activities for sensory play and learning. As we talk about what they are observing and sensing, we give them new language tools to connect with these more familiar sensory tools, building language as well as supporting cognitive





concepts specific to the experience.

## Creative Area

One way of encouraging children's creativity and imagination is through arts and crafts; where they can also develop selfexpression. Children are given a variety of materials to choose from to create their art.

# Listening Area

Children can practice their "listening and comprehension" in this area.

Audiobooks are available for them which also help them with their imagination and sound recognition as they are guided when to flip the pages.

On Thursdays, all the Big Kids swim together and have lunch together. They also join together during afternoon activities where they work in their activity books and play some group and lotto games.

Tran Ngoc Dien, which was full of excitement and fun. They
liked the school with its big play area, climbing house, new
toys and resources.

On the 4th of November, we celebrated International Day. It was nice to see some children wearing their own clothes from different countries. They had fun making their flags and talking about their country.

Starting November 7th, we are going to begin
Jolly Phonics. Children will learn one sound every
week, which will be introduced on Mondays.
During Wednesdays, children can bring things
from home that start with the 'sound of the
week' for Show and Tell (e.g. toys, books)
