
As the children move to a new school or a new country, it is important to support them with this important transition. One way to do this is through literature. We have the book "Sammy's Next Move" by Helen Maffini that we use to read to the children to help them with their transition.

Sammy's Next Move is a wonderful story about a snail named Sammy who lives around the world with his parents. He is a 'Third Culture Kid', TCK or global nomad. He often moves to new countries and has to change schools and



make new friends. Sammy experiences the feelings and thoughts common to children in similar situations. Sammy is a snail and so he carries his home with him wherever he goes, just as a third culture kid does by knowing that home is where their heart is!

The term "Third Culture Kid" a term coined by Dr. Ruth Hill Useem, Professor Emeritus at the Michigan State Univ. Institute for International Studies and a pioneer researcher in the experiences of internationally mobile children. The term TCK suggests that children who spend a portion of their childhood outside of their own country belong to a separate "third" culture distinct from that of their home or host countries.



Children's Yoga

Children derive enormous benefits from yoga. Physically, it enhances their flexibility, strength, coordination, and body awareness. On Friday's in the Big Kids, I teach yoga. We used the yoga postures as a springboard for exploration of other areas—animal adaptations and behavior and storytelling. I also teach a yoga pose to correspond to the Jolly Phonics letter that the children learn each week. I am using the book "the ABCs of YOGA for KiDS by Teresa Anne Power. During the weekend of May 18-20th I attended a "Yoga for Children from Toddlers to Teens" workshop by Samadhi Family Yoga. I learned several new songs that I am looking forward to sharing with the children. Lynn



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
